One thing that has brought people together in the past, using both the power of nostalgia and love of history, are the other milestone commemorative events held in our various boroughs and communities over the years. They've all had healthy participation, produced fond memories, and fostered a sense of community pride. We want our county residents and visitors to walk away from this event proud of their history, more educated on community roots and how far we've come, and with a heightened sense of unity.

We also want to use this day to highlight our county's churches and helpful non-profit organizations by providing you with a fundraising opportunity.
